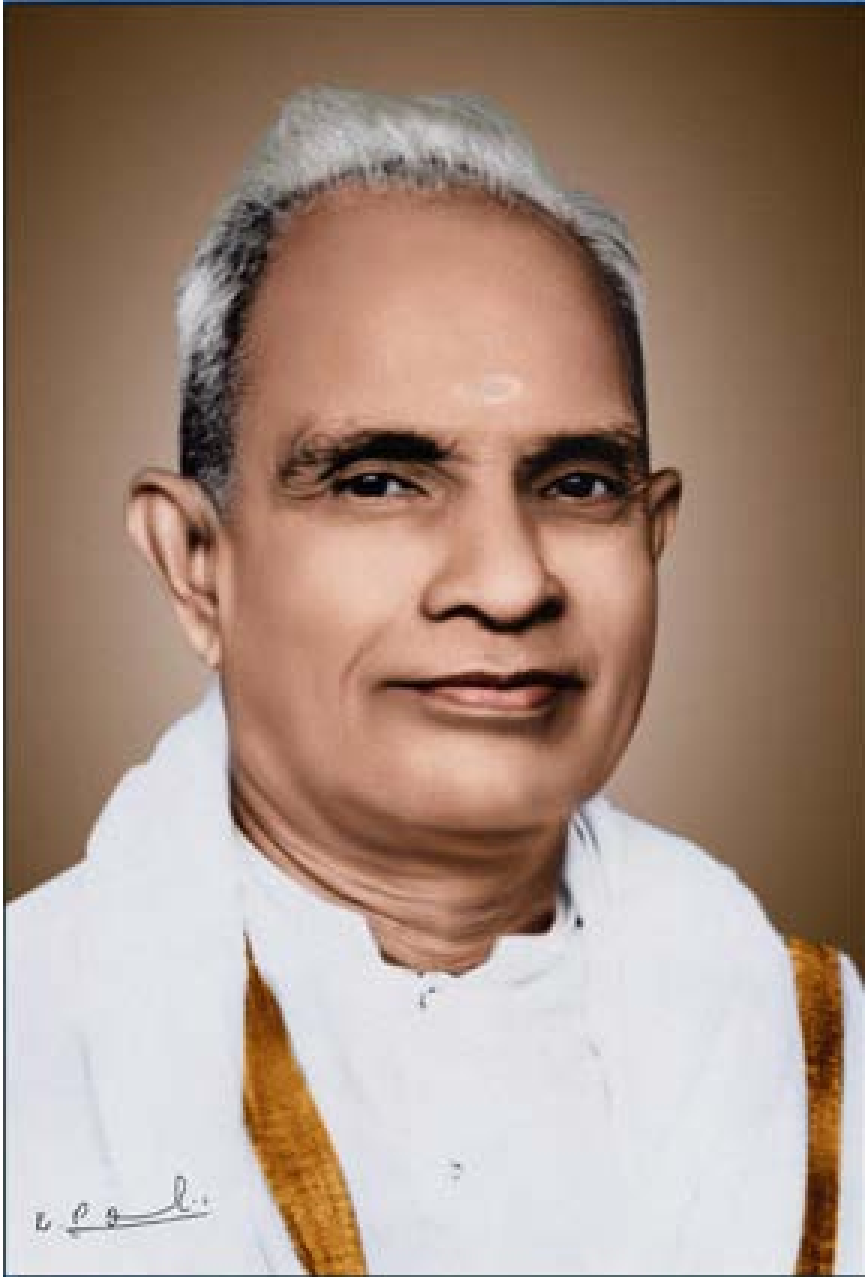

About the Founder

Shri. Mannathu Padmanabhan, the peerless leader of the Nair Community, the immortal founder of the Nair Service Society and the great social reformer was born in the closing decades of the 19th century in Perunnai, a village in Changanacherry taluk of the erstwhile state of Travancore as the son of middle-class parents. Abject poverty, misery and deprivation marked the early years of his life. After school education he became a teacher and then a pleader. Before long he found himself drawn into the vortex of political and social movements. The plight of the Nair Community that was witnessing its own decadence and disintegration, precipitated by extravaganza, superstitious veneration for antiquated and anachronistic customs and tradition, filled him with anguish. He marshalled his oratorical skill and organizational ability to motivate, inspire and mobilize the community that was lost in a long and deep slumber. The Nair Service Society which he conceived, nursed and nurtured, epitomized the hopes and aspirations of the community which had been waiting for a saviour.

Mannam's personal life was inextricably intertwined with the history of the N.S.S. He travelled extensively through the state, met the people, organized them and won their love and regard with the help of his disarming simplicity, single-minded devotion, will and determination. Impregnable fortress of superstition and formidable citadel of resistance crumbled before his all-conquering and awe-inspiring personality. Gradually he built an empire out of

nothing. The prestigious institutions founded by him would perpetuate his memory. Captivated by Mahatma Gandhi and his principles of Satyagraha, Mannam led a Satyagraha march called “Savarnajatha” for the sake of the untouchables. It ultimately led to the “Temple Entry Proclamation”. The dynamic roles he played in the “Vaikom Satyagraham” and in the independence struggle and his subsequent imprisonment and his initiatives aimed at communal harmony, peace and social changes turned him into a legend in his life time. The major milestones in the history of the N.S.S intersect the social, political and cultural history of Kerala. Mannam passed away at the ripe age of 93. The story of his life is the stuff, fairy tales are made of. The touch of his magic wand revived and resurrected the entire community. He taught them the philosophy of action, the value of unity and above all the need to change. His legacy is undiminished by passage of time. He lives through generations.

COLLEGE AT A GLANCE



N. S. S. College, Manjeri is a Govt. Aided Arts & Science College of Nair Service Society. The College is affiliated to University of Calicut and is one of the oldest institutions of higher learning in Malappuram District. The idea to start a College at Manjeri was conceived by Shri. Pulikkat Achuthan Nair. The meeting to discuss the possibility of a College under Nair Service Society was attended by Shri. Mannath Padmanabhan and a committee constituted for this. The college was inaugurated by Shri. P.M. Thirumulpad on 15th July 1965. It is situated on a hill of scenic beauty comprising vast area donated by Shri. P. M. Thirumulpad that provides an ideal atmosphere for the pursuit of higher education. The College was upgraded to first grade on 12th August 1970. The college is owned and managed by the Nair Service Society which considers education as a social service. It is sincerely engaged in providing free and fair education to all without any consideration of class, creed and community with due consideration to the economically backward sections of the society. Like the other 23 Colleges owned and nursed by Nair Service Society, this College also owes its origin to its legendary founder Padmabhushan Mannathu Padmanabhan. Shri. G. Sukumaran Nair, General Secretary, Nair Service Society is constantly looking upon the growth and development of the college. Prof. R. Prasanna Kumar, Secretary, N. S. S. College's Central Committee is eagerly monitoring the day to day activities of the college on its path to accomplish the mission.

The college was formally inaugurated by Sri. P.M. Thirumulpad on 15th July 1965. The jubilee of the institution was celebrated with splendor in 1990 and a new two storied block was declared opened by Sri. P.K. Narayana Panicker, the then General Secretary, Nair Service Society.

A new stadium was constructed with the help of UGC in the vicinity of the Institution. A Computer lab, Language lab and a fully equipped seminar hall are recent additions to the facilities available to students. The computer lab conducts a training programme with the aim of acquiring 100% computer literacy among the staff and students of the college.

At present this college offers eight Under Graduate courses and three Post Graduate courses. A strong faculty comprising 44 teachers, sixty percent of whom are Research Degree holders manages the teaching and learning process.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- Students shall not bring outsiders to the college.
- Using mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the campus.
- Campus should be kept clean and beautiful.
- Students shall leave the campus as soon as the classes are over for the day.
- Students shall obey the rules framed by the Principal for the smooth functioning of the institution.
- Neckband identity card is compulsory for all students and should wear it in the campus.
- Any tampering or disfiguring made on the identity card will be viewed seriously.
- Smoking, alcohol, tobacco consumption and drug trafficking are prohibited in the campus.
- 75 % attendance is compulsory to appear for University examination.
- Students are requested to remit all fees before the last date given, failing which they will be removed from the college rolls on the next working day itself without further notice. Such students are not eligible for attendance. (Govt. order No. Audit B1/106085/2001/coll. Edn., dated 29-10-01).

Prohibition of Political Activity

- Students shall not get involved in any political activity by him or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.
- Taking part in any political activity by organizing or cause gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any such activities as defined by rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal shall have the power to

take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.

- It shall constitute gross indiscipline to call for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties or their student organizations or student wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed appropriate punishment as provided in these rules.
- No student of the college shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gharao, and obstructing entry to and from any class room, office or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct.
- No student shall shout slogans inside the class rooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct or cause disturbance and nuisance to the normal functioning of the institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.

Parking of vehicles

- Students are allowed to park their vehicles in the campus only with the prior written permission of the Principal. Application in the prescribed format should be submitted in this regard.

Punishment for misconduct

Disciplinary action will be taken against students who commit misconduct as referred to in rules above, after conducting proper enquiry by a commission duly appointed by the college council, if necessary. The punishment may be

1. Fine
2. Issuance of the compulsory TC
3. Dismissal from the college

In the event of imposition of punishment of Dismissal or compulsory Issuance of TC, the case will be reported to the University.

Prohibition of damage to property

Students shall not disfigure the class room, compound wall, or other buildings, inside the college campus by pasting posters or writing on the walls in connection with any activity. They shall not damage or destroy any furniture, equipment and other materials inside the campus. In the event of any student indulging in any such activities, a fine shall be imposed on him/her to be fixed by the Principal of the college after evaluating the extent and magnitude of the damage so caused. The aforesaid imposition of fine without prejudice to the liability of the delinquent student for prosecution under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code or under the provisions of prevention of damage of public properties act. The damage so fixed by the Principal shall be recovered as arrears of land revenue and in the event of non-payment, the recovery proceedings shall be taken against the person responsible.

Prohibition of ragging

Ragging is prohibited in the College campus as per the Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998 and UGC Regulations 2009. According to Section 2(B) of the act, ragging can be any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution, causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting, teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do something which he/she voluntarily won't dare to do normally. Anti ragging committee, Anti ragging squad and Student's mentoring cell are constituted to curb the menace of ragging in the College campus.

Punishment for ragging

Any student involved in ragging/persuades others for ragging or advocates ragging /either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subject to a punishment of not more than 2 years imprisonment in addition to a penalty of Rs. 10,000/-. A student who is punished for ragging is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of 3 years from the date of receipt of his/her dismissal order.

If a student/parent/guardian or any teacher of the institution forwards a written complaint to the Principal, he has to make an urgent enquiry into the matter within 7 days of the receipt of such a complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings. If a written complaint is received by the Principal, he has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless, the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

Admission and withdrawal

1. Students are usually admitted only in the beginning of the 1st term of the year to the degree and post graduate courses.
2. Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form which can be had from the college on payment of a registration fee of Rs. 30/-
3. Applicant for admission to the 1st year degree class must have passed the +2 of Govt. of Kerala or 12th class of CBSE or an examination recognized equivalent there to. Those for admission to Post Graduate course must have passed degree examinations in the concerned subject with the required minimum percentage of marks.
4. Candidates seeking admission must produce transfer and conduct certificates from the school or college they last attended and qualifying certificates and mark list in original at the time of admission.
5. Candidates seeking admission to the college from other universities should apply for recognition from the University of Calicut.
6. Candidates considered for admission will be required to appear for an interview before the principal after receiving the intimation card. The selection is provisional and is subject to confirmation after the interview and scrutiny of the certificates.
7. Candidates selected for admission will have to pay the required tuition fees due at the time of admission, caution deposit and all other fees prescribed by the college. Fees once paid will not be returned.

8. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fees he/she may have paid.
9. Students belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe and converts from these castes and tribes as evidenced by their S.S.L.C. Certificate need not pay any tuition fees. Students belonging to other backward classes and converts from other region should produce the community and income certificate from the regional Tahsildar at the time of admission, failing which they will not be exempted from the payment of fees.
10. A student applying for Transfer Certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/ she pays all fees and other dues as the principal may deem fit. Usually transfer certificates are not issued to the students before the completion of their courses of study.
11. A late fee of Rs. 25 will be charged if a student applies for T.C one year after the beginning of the academic year immediately following that during which he/she has been last enrolled. A fee of Rs 50/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate transfer certificate.
12. Students who have left the college with T.C are not eligible to get a new one for a second time. However duplicate certificate will be issued on production of an affidavit signed by a Judicial First Class Magistrate.
13. A student applying for the release of any document from the college must have cleared all dues to the college.
14. A fees of Rs.100/- will be charged for a document that needs reference to the record older than five years.

Academic tenure and Attendance

1. The academic year 2019– 2020 will begin and end as follows:

Odd Semester: June, July, August, September, October & November

Even Semester: December, January, February & March

The teaching day is divided into two sessions, the forenoon session of three periods and the afternoon session of two periods. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the teacher engaging the class. Late comers

will not be entertained. For the purpose of attendance, all teaching days irrespective of working periods shall be considered as full working days. Absenting an hour in any session will be treated as half days absence. Leave for one hour can be obtained from the teacher in charge of the class.

2. Application for long leave should be made to the Principal through the class tutor and HOD. Application for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by reliable medical certificate.
3. Absence for more than 10 consecutive days without proper reason will result in the removal of name from the rolls.
4. Promotion to the senior classes and appearance for University Examinations shall be subjected to the following conditions.
 - a. The student should have earned at least 75% of the attendance prescribed by the college for the course during the year.
 - b. She/he should have completed the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the college authorities and his/her progress, conduct and character should be satisfactory.
 - c. NCC cadets will not be sent for the university examinations or the annual examination of the college if he/she has not earned 75% attendance at the NCC parades.
 - d. A student who has not registered for the University examinations for the junior class will not be eligible for promotion to the next class.
5. No concession of attendance will be allowed to College Union Office Bearers for organizing College Union Activities. But attendance to those office bearers will be allowed as per University Guidelines.
6. Student seeking exemption from rules relating to minimum attendance should apply for exemption to the University through the Principal before 28th February. Every application for exemption shall be made in the prescribed form accompanied by a chalan for required fee. The reason for each day's absence has to be explained. In case of absence on account of illness, medical certificate should also be furnished. No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that

the shortage of attendance was beyond the student's control. In no case will exemption be granted by the University if the shortage of attendance exceeds 20 days. Exemption will not be granted to the same student for more than one academic year in a course. Absence without leave will not be considered under any circumstances.

Caution Deposit

1. The caution deposit paid by a student for a particular course shall be refunded to him/her after deducting dues if any at the end of the course.
2. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit paid by him/her for the particular course immediately after the closing date of the college after the expiry of the academic year in which the course is completed or earlier when the claim for refund arises.
3. The caution deposit can be sent by money order at the student's cost if he/she makes a request to this effect in writing.

College Council

Day to day administration of the College is carried out by the Principal who is assisted by the College Council and various other committees appointed jointly by the Council and Principal. The college Council which is a statutory advisory body constituted with the Principal, Heads of Departments and two teachers elected from among the members of the teaching staff.

Tutorial System

In order to improve all round performance of students and to provide personal attention, tutorial system has been introduced in the college. At the beginning of the academic year, students are divided into different batches and placed under the personal charge of a teacher, designated as Group Tutor. He/She will keep regular watch over the attendance, progress and conduct of the wards under him/her and will give necessary guidance. Students shall forward all applications to the principal through the concerned tutor. The progress report of the students will be intimated to parents by the tutor. Parents are suggested to contact the concerned tutor and discuss the all-round

performance of their wards in the college. The college tutorial system will be organized and guided by a Coordinator nominated by the Principal.

All classes have class tutors who are responsible for the conduct of regular tutorial meeting. The students are free to discuss their specific problems with the tutor in addition to the general problems faced by the class.

Library and Reading room

The college has a centralized library with a full time librarian and supporting staff. The library has a central section, a reference section and a section for periodicals. A library advisory committee entrusted by the Council monitors the functioning of the library.

Library rules.

1. The Library and the reading room will be opened from 9 am to 4 pm on all working days.
2. Books from the General library will be issued on days and hours notified by the Librarian.
3. Application for books must be made in writing in prescribed forms.
4. Students must examine books issued to them and report damages, if any, to the Librarian before taking them away.
5. Books issued must be returned within fifteen days from the date of issue.
6. Students who fail to return the books within the due date shall pay a fine of 50 Paise per book per day.
7. Strict silence must be observed in the reading room.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

As a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure as prescribed by the NAAC, N. S. S. College, Manjeri established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in 2013. The IQAC being an integral part of the college works towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement by developing a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in different aspects of functioning of the college. The IQAC assures the stakeholders i.e., students, parents, teachers, staff, Management, funding agencies and society in general of the accountability and

transparency in the quality management system of the institution and its concern for ensuring quality of education being imparted.

National cadet corps (NCC)

There is an NCC sub unit comprising one Officer and 107 cadets in the College. Those who wish to join in NCC can contact the Officer, and training will be for a period of 3 academic years. Cadets with enough attendance and achievements are granted special incentives and benefits by University and Government in the form of bonus marks and grace marks.

Aims of NCC are:-

- 1) To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure, sportsmanship and ideals of selfless service among the youth of the country.
- 2) To create human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always be available for the service of the nation.
- 3) To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces. Training in NCC instills qualities like nationalism, patriotism, discipline, team spirit, leadership and self confidence and promotes overall personality development. NCC gives a tremendous opportunity to one and all for betterment irrespective of cast, creed, religion or economic status.

National service scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme provides opportunities for involvement of students in community work. The college has two units of National Service Scheme, with one hundred volunteers each.

Aim

Development of the personality of students through community services.

Objectives

1. To work with and among the common people.
2. To enhance creative and constructive social action.
3. To enable students to understand the basic needs of the community.
4. To gain skills in programme development.
5. To enable them to get self employment.
6. To develop leadership qualities.

7. To bridge the gulf between the educated and the uneducated masses.
8. To promote among the students the will to serve the weaker sections of the society.

Enrollment to N.S.S is optional to all students of degree classes. An N.S.S volunteer who completes 240 hours of regular social service and attend one annual training camp will be issued a certificate by the University. This certificate holder will get incentives and bonus marks for getting admission to higher studies

College Union

The college union exists for coordinating the activities of the various college associations, to organize collegiate and inter collegiate debates, lectures by distinguished persons and to promote and strengthen unity among the students of the College. The College union and the allied associations will be constituted in the College according to the rules and regulations, laid down by the University of Calicut from time to time and as per the court order

College Magazine

The college magazine is published once in an year during the third term. It is issued to all students and members of the staff. The Principal will be the Chief Editor and the student editor is elected by all the students of the college. In all matters connected with the magazine the decision of the principal shall be final.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

With a view to develop contacts between the guardians of students and teachers of the college, a Parent Teacher Association has been formed. It is expected that such an association will give a proper forum for the guardians and teachers to have close contacts. The association can also help much in the all-round development of the college such as instituting endowments, scholarships, prizes, medals, etc. to deserving students. The basic fund of the PTA will be the annual membership fee collected from the students.

College Co-Operative Society

A College Co-operative society works in the college. All the staff and students of the college are members of the society. Various text and note books and other stationary items are provided to the members at concessional rate in the college co-operative store.

College Canteen

A college canteen functions in the campus. Meals in the noon and other refreshments are available in the canteen to students and staff at concessional rates.

Health club and Medical inspection

A health club is functioning in the college with Head, Department of Physical Education as convener. All students of I UG and I PG classes will be medically examined by a doctor at the beginning of the year who will submit a report to the Principal. The student shall undergo treatment and resort to such remedies as prescribed by the doctor. The failure of a student in presenting himself/herself for medical inspection at the appointed time will be reported to the University.

Scholarship & Grants

Various scholarships and financial assistances are made available to deserving students. Some among them are National Merit Scholarship, MHRD & UGC scholarships, National loan Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, University Merit Scholarship etc. Fee concession is available to student whose yearly income is less than Rs.100000/- (KPCR) and financial assistance is available to students of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe categories.

Hornbill Nature Club

I.T. and Computer club

A computer lab with a full time instructor is functioning under the IT club. The club aims on acquiring 100% computer literacy to all the students and staff of the College. Broadband Internet as well as DTP facilities are available to members at subsidized rates.

Physical Education Council

The College Physical Education Council is constituted with the Principal as the President. A nominated member of the staff will be the Vice President and the Head of the Department of Physical Education will be the secretary. The President, Vice President, Secretary and Captains of various sports clubs shall be the members of the Executive committee of the council. There shall be separate clubs for Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Cricket, Basket Ball,

Badminton and Track and Field events. The captain of each club will be elected by its own members. The Head of the Department of Physical Education will conduct the election. The students of the college are strictly forbidden to enroll in any team outside the college without the written permission of the Principal.
