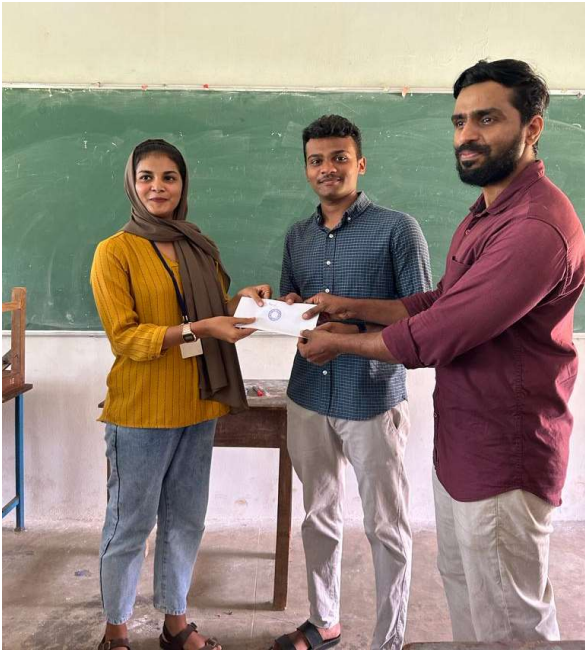


YOGA DAY

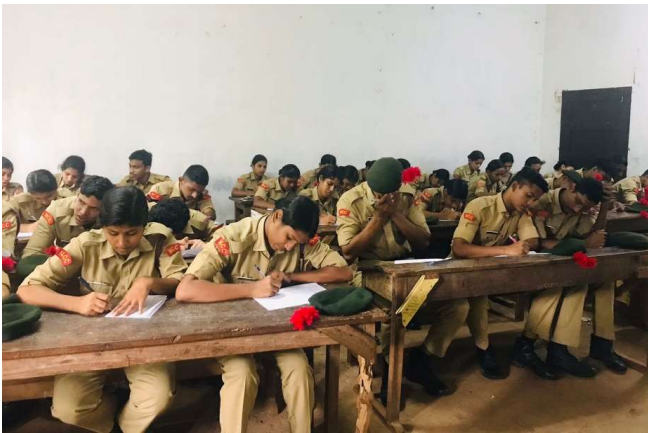


KARGIL WAR

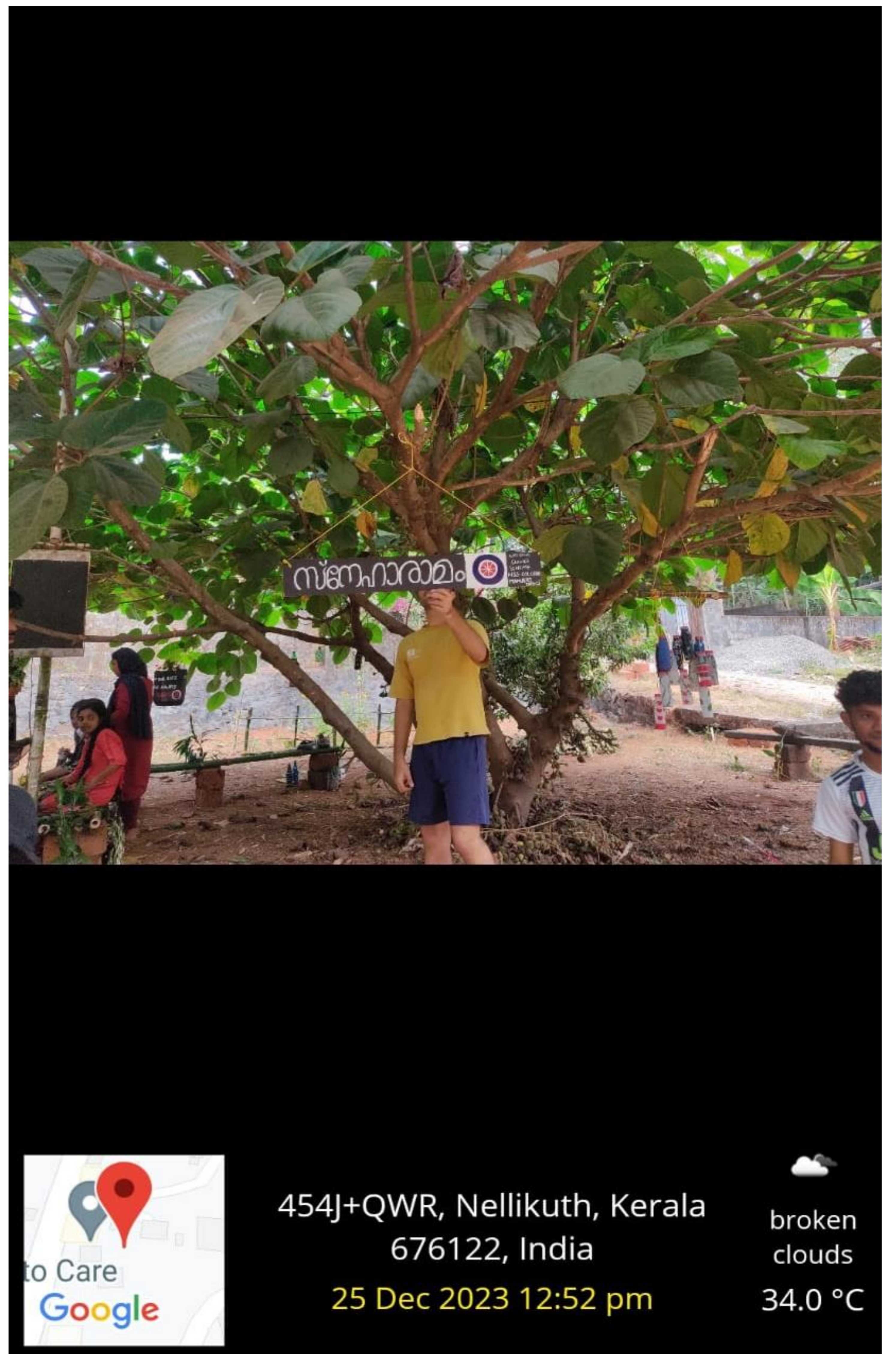
